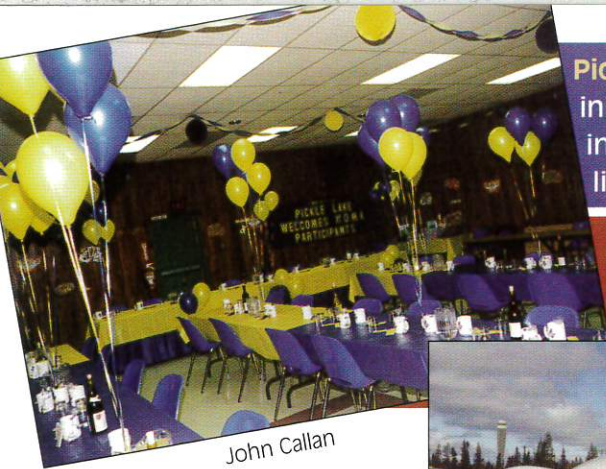

**Pickle Lake** is a full-service community located in the heart of northwestern Ontario. **Pickle Lake** was initially developed as a mining community in the 1920's and has sustained the booms and busts of the industry throughout much of the century, seeing many former residents return to work and live in **Pickle Lake**.

Airline companies provide daily flight service to northern communities and major cities including Winnipeg and Thunder Bay, and charter service to all outlying areas. Several land transportation companies provide freight service into and out of **Pickle Lake** in the warmer months and have extended service north of Pickle Lake during winter freeze-up.



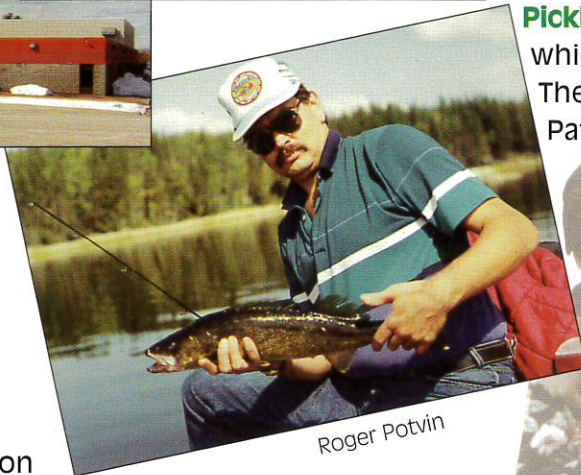

**Pickle Lake** has one of the most modern police stations in the province. Emergency ambulance service is provided by the **Pickle Lake Volunteer Ambulance Service** in addition to the **Pickle Lake Volunteer Fire Department** which provides fire protection and rescue services 24 hours a day.

Crolancia Public School is an up-to-date modern public school offering education for children from kindergarten to grade nine. Post-secondary education is provided through Confederation College in Thunder Bay using Contact North. Private schooling with a biblical perspective is also available for grades one through twelve with Friendship Baptist Academy.

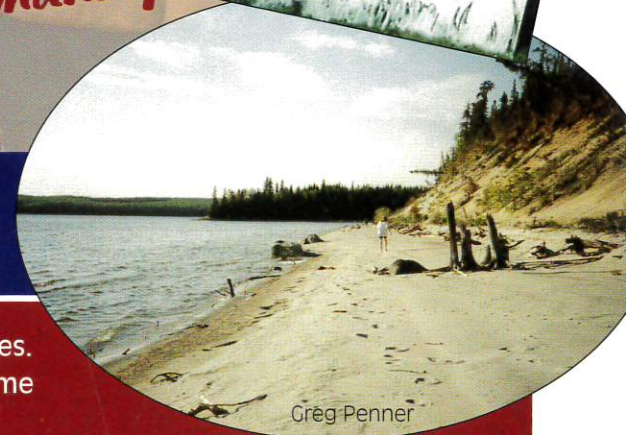

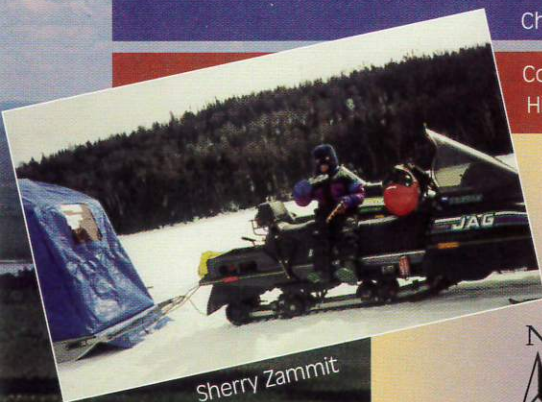

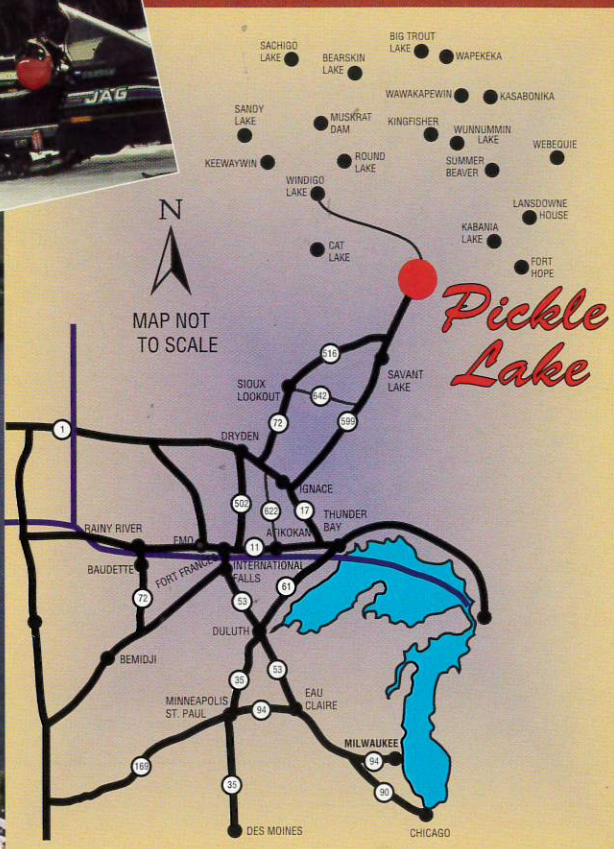
