 - -frontier camp will be going into reduced numbers and most workers moved to Pipestone camp due to project progression.
 - Adequate supplies on hand for the base only. Daily inventory submitted to central provincial database.
 - -Mishkeegogamang nursing station is handing out 3 main phone numbers and one on call phone number for non-urgent medical issues to call prior to calling EMS.

3.2. OPP Sgt. Kevin Thomas

-Emailed update 4 and 4 split with Sgt. Jim Davis from Atikoken.

3.3 MNRF Steve Anderson

- -Daily self-assessment tool required to be utilized by all staff.
- Staff will continue to arrive on basis deemed by weather and fire probability.
- -Isolation unit housing options and further social distancing housing still being explored, may include ATCO trailers on Rose Ave. lots owned by Infrastructure Ontario.

3.4 Pickle Lake Fire Rescue Chief Garrick Halteman

- Duty to respond to calls still active
- -Practices still suspended, Deputy Chief Koval and Captain Dalzell working on distance education for firefighters.
- -Water still an issue at hall however PPE and bucketed hand washing measures set up.
- -PPE numbers submitted weekly to Larry Lundy for Provincial tracking.

3.6 Clerk Treasurer Jamie Hussey

-No further updates from MMAH regarding funding for municipalities. We are tracking all PPE expenses.

- -NWHU update emailed Thursday, 3 more confirmed cases in Dryden, all travel related, all isolated, all recovered prior to test results coming back.
- -Local MP's working hard on support for camps, Northern Ontario businesses.
- -Community Board update tomorrow.

- -PPE supply good
- -Staff continuing sanitization and safety measures.
- 3.8 Mayor Monck
- We have secured further hand sanitizer through Evana Energy.
- -No further update from Chief Masakeyash on road closure.
- -KDMA conference call some local communities have discussed securing hotel blocks for quarantine measures, not necessary at this time in Pickle Lake.
- -Still issues between Kenora and Manitoba with cottagers moving around, Kenora would like Manitobans to stay home, Manitoba would like Ontarians to refrain from shopping out of Province. General consensus is to stay home.
