 - -Health inspections for Restaurants resuming in region.

3.2 MNRF Steve Anderson

- -RFZ was lifted on Saturday at 12:01 am.
- -Fire Risk diminished.
- -Staffing levels remaining same.
- -Bombers currently station in hot spots to the Northeast regions of Ontario.

3.3 OPP James Davis

- Continued education to community members regarding gathering in large groups.
- -Reminding individuals the school structures are closed to the public.

3.4 Nurse Johnson

-No changes, Dr. Mooney is in and seeing patients, has been tested for COVID and is masked to see patients.

3.5 PLFR

- Still reporting PPE to Larry Lundy.
- -No new updates.

3.6 Councillor Blakney

- -Start reopening Markets on June 27th, economic support for small businesses. Dryden, Neebing and Thunder Bay have begun. Social distancing practices, hand sanitation station, educate people and vendors. Council in agreeance.
