## **Emergency Preparedness**

### **In case of an evacuation due to a forest fire**

#### **What to have in your emergency bag:**

**Identification (Passport, birth certificate, health card, status card, SIN number)**

**Important documents (Insurance policies, marriage certificates, house deed, banking information)**

**Cash (\$200)**

**Gas (keep your fuel topped up throughout fire season)**

**Water kit**

**Clothing for at least 2 days**

**Pet kit (Food, water, leash, toys, vaccination records)**

**Medication**

**Assistive devices (Hearing aids, glasses, canes, crutches)**

**Phones/ chargers**

**Children's formula/ medications**

#### **In the Event of an Evacuation**

##### ***DO NOT PANIC***

**Stay at home until you are told by an official to leave your home- if you are not home**

**when an evacuation officer (EO) arrives, a notice will be left on your door.**

**You will be given direction by your evacuation officer on how the evacuation is being**

**staged whether that be via road or air and what direction you are to move in.**

**Arrangements for pets will be made by officials if air evacuation is required.**

**Leave behind all unnecessary personal items.**

**When you arrive to your muster station, have your EO document ready for registration officials.**

## **72 Hour Emergency Preparedness Kit**

**Below is a sample list of items that should be in your 72 – Hour Emergency Kit. This and any special needs that someone in your family might have, also include any additional items that your family would need.**

### **Emergency Survival Kit**

- Food (see food kit)**
- Bottled water (see water kit)**
- Flashlight and spare batteries or crank flashlight**
- Radio or crank radio (so you can listen to news bulletins)**
- First-aid kit**
- Candles, matches/ lighter**
- Extra car keys and cash (including coins / cards for telephones)**
- Gas for generators**
- Important papers (identification for everyone, personal documents such as insurance papers)**
- Clothing and footwear (one change of clothing per person)**
- Blankets or sleeping bags (one blanket or sleeping bag per person)**
- Toilet paper/ paper towels**
- Personal supplies such as: shampoo, hairbrush, toothbrush and toothpaste, soap, and a towel for each person**
- Medication and copies of prescription**
- Backpack /duffel bag (or something else to carry the emergency survival kit in)**
- Whistle (in case you need to attract someone's attention)**
- Playing Cards**

### **Additional Equipment**

- Knives, forks, spoons, disposable cups, and plates**
- Manual can opener/ bottle opener**
- Fuel stove and fuel (follow manufacturer's instructions; never use a barbecue indoors)**
- Waterproof matches and plastic garbage bags**
- Pocket knife or multi-tool**
- Duct tape**

### **Car Kit**

- Food (see food kit)**
- Bottled water (see water kit)**
- Shovel**
- Sand, Salt, or kitty litter**
- Traction mats**

### **Car Kit Continued....**

**Flashlight and spare batteries or crank flashlight**

**Compass**

**Toilet paper**

**Paper towel**

**Warning light or road flares**

**Extra clothing and footwear**

**Axe or hatchet**

**Ice scraper and brush**

**Road maps**

**Matches and “survival” candle in a deep can (to warm hands, heat a drink or use as emergency light)**

**Fire extinguisher**

**Methyl hydrate (for fuel line and windshield de-icing)**

**First-aid kit with seatbelt cutter**

**Blanket or special “survival” blankets**

### **Additional Considerations:**

#### **Babies/ Toddlers:**

**Diapers, bottled milk, formula and food, small toys, crayons/paper**

#### **Other Family Members**

**Keep at least one-week supply of medication in your emergency kit and include extra eye-glasses, spare batteries for medical appliances and an extra oxygen cylinder if needed. Include copies of prescriptions for your medicine and glasses.**

#### **Pets:**

**Include a three-day supply of pet food and water.**

#### **Food Kit:**

**Have at least a three-day supply of food on hand. Choose ready-to-eat foods that your family likes and that do not need refrigeration. Canned food, such as: soups, stews, baked beans, pasta, meat, poultry, fish, vegetables, and fruit work well. Additionally, crackers and biscuits, honey, peanut butter, syrup, jam, salt and pepper, sugar, instant coffee, and tea. If the food kit is being used as part of a car kit, consider the impact that outdoor temperature will have on it if it is being permanently left in your car.**

#### **Water Kit:**

**At least four liters per person per day should be allocated- two for drinking and two for food preparation, hygiene, and dish washing. Keep a supply of water purification tablets on hand as well. If the water kit is being used as part of a car kit, consider the impact that the temperature outdoors would have on it if it is being left permanently in your car.**

## KEEP BEARS AT BAY

The Township has 1 bear trap that is currently set up and rotate locations around town based on nuisance complaints and visible sightings. If a bear is caught it is humanly transported up the north road and released back into the wild.

Some tips on avoiding bears visiting your garbage box are:

- Ensure your garbage is in the box and the box is not overflowing.
- Make sure garbage is bagged, not loose.
- Ensure your box has a lid, the box is in good repair and a heavy object is set on top to keep the lid closed.
- Bears have a keen sense of smell, so rinsing meat trays, cans etc. before placing them in the garbage deter bears from paying you a visit.
- Dispose of fish cleanings on garbage day, do not let your remnants sit in the garbage can for days, the landfill is open 3 days a week and there is NO CHARGE for residential garbage.
- Freeze your remnants and dispose of them on garbage day, to avoid smelly garbage bins.
- If your garbage bin is getting smelly, wash it out with the hose and liquid detergent.
- Keep pets indoors after dusk, do not leave dog/cat food outdoors for extended periods of time.

In the event a bear does get into your garbage, please pick it up after the bear has moved on to avoid more bears or other animals visiting the area.

Hopefully the whole town has heard of us by now, a new social group who was giving away wonderfully fresh peppers, tomatoes, carrots, cucumbers and potatoes. We are, however, more than just one-time food giver-outers so let us introduce ourselves and tell you more about those 2 beautiful days full of sunshine and free veggies.

We are InclusivACTION, a social inclusion group in Pickle Lake facilitated by Amanda Pickett. That means we are here to improve participation in our community through enhancing opportunities, and access to resources. We are a positive voice and we are leading with a respect for rights for everyone, especially those disadvantaged.

This journey started for us when we realized the opportunity through the Ontario Government and their mission to create a more inclusive Ontario. From the beginning, we had a desire to help our Elders. We all know about the unique struggles of living in a remote northern community. Those struggles are multiplied for the oldest members of Pickle Lake, a lot of them who have roots in this town and have been a part of it from the beginning. We turned to the Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility for help and from that, InclusivACTION was born. We were provided with a planning guide and an Inclusive Community Grant. Our plan for the next year is to assess the needs in Pickle Lake, to develop an action plan, and to implement it. We don't want to bore you with facts about ministries and grants so let's get to the fun stuff, the meat and potatoes (pun intended – because we gave out a lot of potatoes!) of what you can expect to see from us.

We started off with a bang last week when a delivery of cases upon cases of fresh vegetables showed up in Pickle Lake from the Regional Food Distribution Association (RFDA). You may be familiar with this association as they provide food to our neighbouring communities. This time, it was our turn to say thank you to every single member of our municipality. We quickly announced on social media that everyone was welcome to come take produce. We called all our friends and asked them to tell all their friends. We all know how fast information spreads through word of mouth in Pickle Lake. The sun even came out for those 2 beautifully warm days. We managed to feed every household we could and spread the word about InclusivACTION. You'll be happy to hear that nothing went to waste. Whatever wasn't eaten by humans was given to the local pigs and chickens. Even the spoiled veg was composted.

But the most successful part of the food distribution was seeing people come out with **the purpose of helping others**.



Crolanica Public School's teacher Kayla Blakney delivered ingredients to each of her high school students and taught a lesson on healthy eating and food preparation via Google Classroom. The class was kind enough to share the recipes they used, a smashed cucumber salad and Italian vegetable stew.

### Smashed Cucumber Salad

1. Using a meat mallet or rolling pin, smash the cucumbers, then slice into bite-size pieces and transfer to a large bowl.
2. Add salt and sugar, and toss to combine.
3. In a small bowl, combine the soy sauce, rice vinegar, and sesame oil.
4. Drizzle the dressing over the cucumbers, then toss to coat.
5. Garnish with toasted sesame seeds and red pepper flakes.
6. Enjoy!

**Note:** 1 tsp of minced red onions are recommend as well

#### Ingredients:

- ↳ 5-8 small cucumbers (2 medium cucumbers)
- ↳ ½ tsp Salt
- ↳ 1 tsp sugar
- ↳ 1 tsp soy sauce
- ↳ 1 tsp rice vinegar (or apple cider vinegar)
- ↳ ½ tsp sesame oil
- ↳ 1 tbsp toasted sesame seeds
- ↳ Red pepper flakes, to taste



### Italian Vegetarian Stew

1. Boil the tomatoes for 15-20 mins on medium heat, then transfer them to an ice water bath until cool to the touch. Peel, core and crush the tomatoes and place them in a medium saucepan on low, with the oil.
2. Chop up the potatoes and carrots (bite-sized). In a separate medium pot, boil the potatoes and carrots for 15-20 mins (or until softened).
3. Chop up the peppers (mince if preferred) and add to tomatoes, along with sugar and spices. Let simmer for 10-15 mins.
4. Add the vegetable broth to the tomato mixture (it would be better if it was already warm).
5. Drain the potatoes and carrots and add them to the broth and tomatoes. Let simmer, stirring constantly. Add more spice as desired.

**Note:** Other vegetables, spices and/or meat can be added as desired.

#### Ingredients:

- ↳ 3-4 Large Tomatoes
- ↳ 3-4 Large Potatoes
- ↳ 1 cup Carrots, sliced
- ↳ 1 Bell Pepper, chopped
- ↳ ¼ tsp Oil (or cooking spray)
- ↳ 4 cups vegetable broth
- ↳ 1 tsp Sugar
- ↳ ¼ tsp Dried Oregano
- ↳ ¼ tsp Dried Basil
- ↳ ½ tsp Salt
- ↳ ¼ tsp Black Pepper




