## 6.1 Mayor & Council

- 6.1.1 Councillor Blakney- Inquired about clinic update from Mishkeegogamang. Clerk stated not much progress, Mishkeegogamang still working hard with SLFNA and Sol Mamakwa. Councillor Blakney recommending communicating our request to Eric Melillo. Clerk will do so.
- -Inquired if the position at the Clinic is still posted. It is still actively posted.
- -Will develop a photo challenge for the February bulletin for community members to participate in for prizes.
- -Would like to post a committee call out for February bulletin. Any committee members that would like to continue actively participating in committees, and fill vacancies in committees if needed.
- -Start a composting program in the spring. Utilize old chlorine buckets for pick up, establish a compost system at the community garden to deposit these collections into.
- -Inquired about establishing a level of recycling, perhaps cardboard to start. We need to be part of the solution.
- -Inquired if a slideshow on fleet could be put together for Council so they know what vehicles need replacing. Clerk will facilitate.

- 6.1.2 Councillor Millar- Inquired about replacing fleet with hook truck systems. A 1-tonne truck with multipurpose attachments. Superintendent to investigate further for budget meeting.
- -Inquired about remaining trees on the hill and why they have not been cut. Clerk will follow up with W. Koval Contracting.
- -Inquired about investigating a new piece of loader equipment with multiple attachments. Loader nearing end of life expectancy, and when replaced we should have equipment with more function diversification.
- 6.1.3 Councillor Walbourne-Requesting no more repairs are put into the dodge. The cost has become increasing over the passed two years and we need to look at replacing this vehicle this year.
  - 6.1.4 Councillor Vaughan- Agrees with all previous council reports/requests.
- -Mentioned the need for firefighters to ensure cables on batteries are not cut at MVC calls when a disconnect is requested by OPP.
- 6.1.5 Mayor Monck- Stated that call outs for Valard and MCL need to be charged for. Operators are being called out all hours of the day and night sometimes multiple times a day costing the Township money. Clerk will email Valard and MCL and let them know of this policy change.
