# 6.1 Mayor & Council

- **6.1.1 Councillor Blakney-** There is a school grant available through NASP for archery equipment for the school. Teachers agree to teach archery to the students, can run as an outdoor program and then eventually inside at Curling Rink if space is converted.

# 6.4 Economic Development Report

6.4.1 Economic Development Report- Written and Spoken

Review of grants received to date including New Horizons for Senior's \$25,000.00, Infrastructure Ontario Safe Drinking Water, Water Tower Rehabilitation \$100,000.00, Ontario Trillium Foundation Resilient Communities Fund \$113,300.00, Ministry of Seniors Accessibility Inclusive Communities Grant Program \$60,000.00 (Council to deliberate terms and conditions of this funding). EDO Intern \$31,500.00. The Lookout online business platform is live. Mail out to all businesses in Pickle Lake to Join.

Review of grants in process of application: NOHFC funding for Curling rink, including new roof, additional equipment, kitchen renovations, possible corridor between arena and curling rink. Agri Spirit/Canada Post Grants applied for additional play structure equipment.

# Community Inclusiveness Grant

Council undertook a full deliberation of the grant objectives and outcomes.

EDO Lynn Cox and Councillor Blakney explained the following items:

- -Money within the grant is designated to hire a co-ordinator for a needs analysis for social assistance needs within the community.
- -The purpose of the project is to identify through a planning exercise who exactly in town requires the social services.
- -These identified needs would lead to a plan on how the needs can be addressed in a long term sustainable way.
- -The grant was applied for because a volunteer approached the township requesting grant opportunities for starting a soup kitchen in town. The Township as a non-for-profit organization was the only entity that could apply for grants related to food securities.
- -Clear policies and procedures would need to be developed to identify who can access the resources and under what conditions (ie. Only when sober)
- -Trial program of 6-12 months, using food donations to draw people to access the resource to help identify the needs of individuals.

Identified issues of this program by Councillor Millar, Mayor Monck, Councillor Walbourne, Councillor Vaughan:

-Create a dependency on a program that is run by volunteers through the township and can cause large problems for property damage if program ends (as has happened historically)

- -The identified social needs are items that should be addressed by a social services group such as KDSB which the municipality pays a levy to monthly.
- -Concerns about creating a large downtown gathering issue again, and possibly enticing individuals from other communities to come join also.
- -Long term concerns of businesses/ tourism being turned off Pickle Lake due to increased levels of foot traffic around the downtown core where a soup kitchen would take place.
- -Donations of food items could be directed to the volunteers who wish to provide meals however the township does not wish to partake in the distribution of food items.
